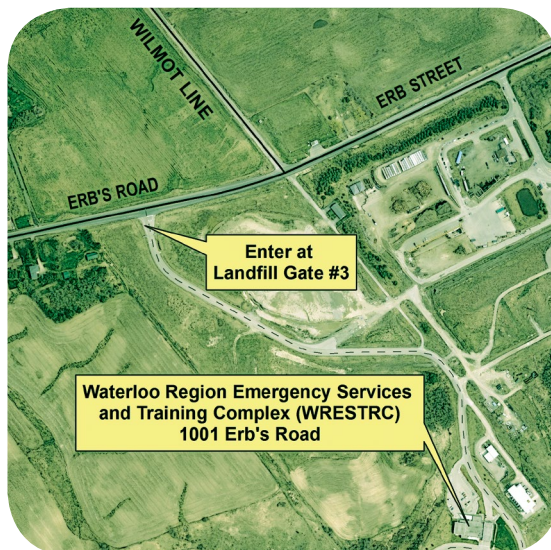
The Region of Waterloo

ESLs are landscapes in Waterloo Region with clusters of significant natural features as well as working farms and small settlements. Totalling more than 15,000 hectares (37,300 acres), the Region's four ESLs are protected by special policies that limit urban expansion and activities in order to preserve these unique environmental and rural features.

The findings of the case study may have broad applicability to road corridors in all four of the Region's ESLs, and will provide greater insight into:

- Enhancing and protecting the value of the ESL to the community
- Protecting creeks, wetlands, and wildlife from the effects of increased traffic and road maintenance
- Retaining or enhancing the scenic quality and rural character of roads in the ESL
- Assessing the impacts of recreational uses, such as hiking, jogging, horseback riding, cycling, skiing, etc. on roads and publicly accessible lands
- Identifying potential issues that could affect safety by causing conflicts between road users (e.g. cars, truck traffic, pedestrians, cyclists, joggers)
