



York University Faculty of Environmental and Urban Change (EUC) Announces Webinar Series on Degrowth: Aim high, degrow: dialogues on degrowth

Commencing November 22, 2023, EUC will present *Aim high, degrow: dialogues on degrowth*, a series of 6 monthly free lunchtime webinars addressing the many sides of degrowth - introducing key degrowth concepts and some of the major issues, debates and possibilities emerging from the field. The Seminar Series will be held virtually, so participants can tune in from anywhere.

Degrowth argues we cannot maintain infinite economic growth on a finite planet. It is a growing global movement of activists and researchers that prioritizes social and ecological well-being ahead of corporate profits, over-production and excess consumption. This requires radical redistribution, reduction in the material size of the global economy and a shift in common values towards care, solidarity and autonomy for people and their communities.

The idea of degrowth is gaining recognition. The <u>New York Times</u> referred to the Pope as a "degrowther" after the recent release of his encyclical, Laudata Si. In May of 2023, thousands from around the world attended online and in person the European Parliament's conference entitled, <u>Beyond Growth</u>, and each year there are conferences and <u>groups on degrowth</u> cropping up around the world.

The seminar series aims to provide a space for deeper dialogues on degrowth, involving scholars and audiences from within and outside the degrowth world to explore key debates and how they connect to other issues like urbanization, decolonization, technology and the role of the state. Each discussion will run for an hour and is programmed around lunch hours. Guest panelists come from around the world and the moderators will be drawn from the Faculty of Environmental and Urban Change at York University.
